Formal Parents' Evening and Interim Written Reports

As promised in a communication towards the end of last term, I have asked the teachers to prepare an interim written report which will be shared at a formal parents' evening in the first term. As I'm sure you can appreciate, after all afternoon in the classroom, the teachers will require a short break and an opportunity to prepare for the Parents' Evening; as such, once the children have been dismissed at the end of the school day, the doors for the school will be closed, re-opening for the Parents' Evening at 4pm. Doors will be locked again from 6.50pm onwards.

Tuesday 20th October (4pm - 5.30pm)

There will be a shorter parents' evening on Tuesday to meet with any parents who were unable to attend on the Monday. Again, once the children have been dismissed at the end of the school day, the doors for the school will be closed, re-opening for the Parents' Evening at 4pm. Doors will be locked again from 5.20pm onwards.

From this coming Monday (21st September) up until Friday 16th October, there will be appointment sheets on display in the Main Entrance Area. Parents will be able to sign up to an appointment with the teachers they would like to see. Please can school request that the appointment sheet is filled in by parents and not their children. Any parents who have not made an appointment by Friday 16th October will be contacted by telephone and offered free slots. Obviously if you do not sign up for an appointment for a time of your choosing, the slots offered to you by telephone may not be as convenient to you. Our expectation is that every child will be represented by a parent at one of the two evenings, and we encourage you to sign up for an appointment as soon as possible.
