

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Message from Mr Kelly

We are rapidly approaching the end of another academic year at Dhoon School. Last year we survived a lockdown. This year, we've survived two lockdowns. ### **Y6 Transition Days to RGS**

On Wednesday 7th and Thursday 8th July, Year Six will not be attending Dhoon School. Instead, they will be based at Ramsey Grammar School, working with their new tutor groups, meeting their new teachers and experiencing some lessons to give a flavour of what to expect from secondary school. There is no requirement for Y6 pupils to come to Dhoon School first on either of these days - pupils should use the days as an opportunity to practice how they will get to and from secondary school, using the bus service if intended. We send good wishes to Y6 for these two taster days and hope that they prove interesting and enjoyable.

#### Classes from September 2021

	Class I	This class will include all children in Reception, Year 1 & Year 2. Their teacher will be Mrs Stewart (now working full time) and she will be supported by Miss Oates and Mrs Goss. Mirroring how we have run this class in previous years, Mrs Stewart and her team will separate out the year groups during certain times of the week for year group specific teaching in smaller groups.
	Class 2	This class will include all children in Year 3 and Year 4. Their teacher will be Mrs Shimmin on a Monday and Tuesday, and Mrs Cross on a Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Mrs Cross is an experienced teacher who has worked in a wide range of schools across the Isle of Man, including experience at Deputy Headteacher level in Arbory School and Michael School. We are pleased to welcome her to our team and are fortunate to have secured someone of her calibre.

This class will include all children in Year 5 and Year 6. Their teacher will be Mr Cross. As you will infer from the information in the table above, Mrs Jaques will no longer be teaching at Dhoon School. Friday 23rd July will mark her final day working at Dhoon after a long, proud and successful association with our

school. Mrs Jaques has indicated that she wanted to reduce her responsibilities and role, and she has secured a position that fits her wishes at Rhumsaa Bunscoil. Everybody knows what an incredible teacher Mrs Jaques is, and her legacy at Dhoon are the countless children she has has inspired through her love of music, her joy and passion for teaching and her commitment which is a true example of someone going "above and beyond." We will say goodbye to Mrs Jaques in the manner that befits someone of her remarkable standing, and give her a proper send off when we reach the end of term. As one door closes, another opens, and I'm delighted to welcome Mrs Cross to the team from September.

#### **Cinema Experience**

The Cinema Experience that we have planned as a thank you to pupils and parents for surviving a tumultuous year and giving unwavering support to the school has been planned for Friday 16th July.
