

Message from Mr Kelly

Happy new year everyone! I trust you all had a super Christmas and a decent break. Hopefully everyone is feeling recharged and enthused about the year ahead - I know that all the teachers are! This time twelve months ago, we didn't even make it to the end of the first week back after Christmas before being plunged into lockdown and switching at speed to remote learning. This year, despite the continuing pandemic, things do feel different. The spread of C19 is being mitigated against through measures such as trying to increase ventilation, and an expectation for adults to wear facecoverings. Many of the steps and measures we take in school reflect decisions made in central Government, in the Department of Education, and by COMIN. I appreciate that there will be a range of views amongst all of you as to what we are doing, but I do hope that the consensus is alive and positive around doing all we can to make sure that the school remains open. Undoubtedly the biggest pressure currently facing our school is concerned with making sure we have enough staff available to operate.
