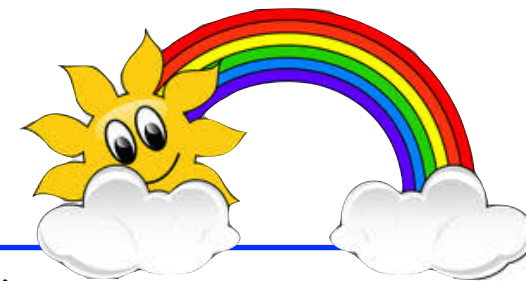














Class One Home learning



<p>Literacy</p>  <p>Remember to read lots, practise spellings and work on letter formation.</p>	<p>Shopping List</p> <p>Write a shopping list for all of the supplies that your family needs OR a list of all of the things that you would like.</p> 	<p>Card or Letter</p> <p>Make a card or write a letter to cheer someone up that is in isolation OR for a grandparent or friend that you are unable to visit.</p> 	<p>Diary</p> <p>Write a diary to record what you have been doing each day and draw a picture to go with each page.</p> 
<p>Numeracy</p>  <p>Remember to work on counting, number bonds and times tables.</p>	<p>Money</p> <p>Make a shop and make some money for your family to spend (or you could use monopoly money if you have some).</p>  <p>Play shops with your family adding up how much their shopping comes to.</p>	<p>Making Charts</p> <p>Choose a minimum of 3 birds that you are likely to see in your garden or from your window.</p>  <p>Record how many times you spot the birds each day, presenting your work in a tally chart or as a graph or pictogram.</p>	<p>Time</p> <p>Create a schedule to show what you have been doing a different times of the day (o'clock and half past).</p>  <p>Check these times on a clock or watch at the start and end of each task.</p>
<p>Theme</p>  <p>Remember to use lots of creativity and curiosity to help you to learn about the world around us.</p>	<p>Make a bird feeder</p> <p>Use an empty milk carton to create a bird feeder or bird bath for the birds,</p>  <p>Think about how you will decorate it and where you will put it for the birds to use.</p>	<p>Create a picture</p> <p>Create a picture of your choice using natural objects that you have found outdoors. eg leaves, twigs, petals, pebbles, shells</p> 	<p>Plant some seeds</p> <p>If you are lucky enough to have some seeds at home, plant them and record their growth. If not, have a go at growing carrot tops in a saucer.</p>
