Literacy

Remember to read lots, practise spellings and work on letter formation.

Alphabet

Write out all of the letters of the alphabet in the correct order and see if you can find the name of a plant or tree that begins with each letter eg. d - daffodil You might need to use some research skills to help you with this one!

Instructions

Follow a recipe to create something delicious, then write your own set of simple instructions to explain how you made it. Share your instructions on our facebook page and then maybe some of your friends can try making it too!

Story

Write a story about an adventure that you go on in your garden or somewhere on the Isle of Man.

Remember to use capital letters and full stops.

Numeracy

Remember to work on counting, number bonds and times tables.

Make a selection of daisy chains and compare their lengths. Count how many daisies have been used for each chain? Can you count the daisies in 2's? How many more daisies would you need to double the length of each chain?

Draw 8 different 2d shapes. Write down its name and 2 facts about each shape. Can you find any of these shapes around your home or garden?

Capacity

This is a fun activity to work on outside! Choose a minimum of 3 containers. Take a cup or yoghurt pot and find out how many scoops it takes to fill each container. Line up your containers in order from smallest to largest. When you are finished, use the water to water any plants in your garden.

Draw or paint a picture of you and your family at home or out in the garden.


