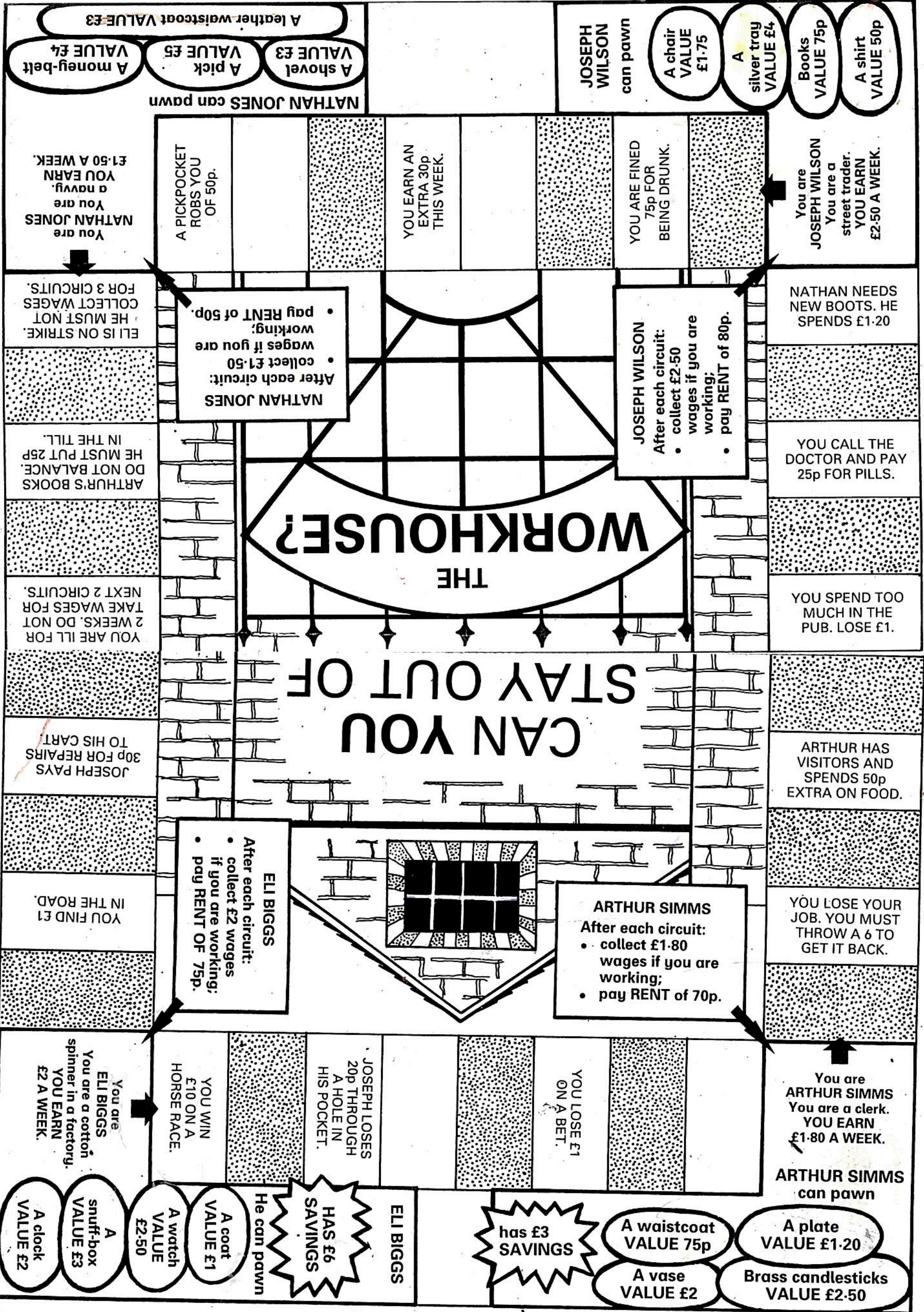


THE WORKHOUSE?
