### Class 3 - Week 4 Remote Learning Maths / Literacy Activity Grid

Within this grid you will find literacy or maths activities, which <u>could provide a focus for learning earlier in the day</u>, before our live lesson (and follow up tasks) each afternoon. Notice how the activities have continued to alternate between <u>numeracy</u> one day, followed by <u>literacy</u> the next, and so on. <u>Resources will be posted on the website.</u>

# Monday 25th January <a href="Short multiplication">Short multiplication</a>

Warm up by practising your times tables because you'll certainly find your tables invaluable here. Use the <u>written method</u> for short X to solve calculations, some of which involve <u>money notation</u> too. You'll find reminders and different levels of challenge too (mild <u>and/or</u> hot?)

Extra Challenge: 'Aim for 60000'

This investigation is shown on slide 11. You may find estimation helpful, and please show your working out using short multiplication too.

## **Tuesday 26th January The Suffragettes**

You'll apply literacy and history skills here, as well as growing your historical knowledge. Your activities:


- **Study powerpoint** (I will discuss in live lesson.)

Extra Challenge:

#### Wednesday 27th January Short division

I have included a 'short division' slideshow already discussed in a live lesson, giving a useful step by step explanation. Use the written method for short division to solve calculations, some which leave a remainder. Different levels of challenge are available, mild and/or hot. (\*If unsure how to convert remainders to fractions, leave as remainder.) Extra Challenge: Slide 9 has some problems to help you 'check your understanding'.



# Thurssday 28th January <a href="What Is Democracy?">What Is Democracy?</a>


Once again you'll apply literacy and history skills here, as well as studying local and global issues too. <u>Your activities</u>:
