



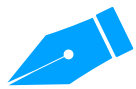
Class 2 Verbs Follow-up task

Remember - verbs are doing, being or action words!



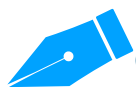
Some verbs are used too much in writing and aren't very interesting. One way that you can improve your writing is to use a variety of **powerful verbs** instead. Examples of this are 'walk' and 'said'.

For this follow-up task I would like you to begin with the words 'walk' and 'said' and try to think of as many different **synonyms** (words that have the same or similar meaning) for them as you can.

I'll start you off with some synonyms for 'walk'.

saunter	stomp	creep	hike	shuffle
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When you have found as many as you can for these two words, have a go at using them in some sentences or paragraphs of your own.



Can you think of any other verbs that aren't very interesting? See if you can do the same for those!
