## Make Your Own Books

You can make fantastic books from just single sheets of paper.
Here are four ideas, ranging from simple to complex for pupils from Foundation to KS4.

Basic folding for all books


In the landscape position fold paper in half.


Open this fold.


Open the sheet.

Fold in half again.


With the fold at the top fold downwards in half.


You have eight rectangles.
You can make hundreds of different books from these eight rectangles. by Paul Johnson. Paul is director of the Book Art Project, the main aim of which is raising standards of writing through the book arts.

## KS2 Make a BOOK WITH A POP-UP CENTREPIECE



Fold in half to A4. On the folded edge children draw and cut e rainbow shape in the top panel.


Fold a slight angle on the rainbow. Reverse the crease. Unfold.

On the front side cut left and right creases to the top edge.

On the slight angle push the pop-up rainbow inside the book. The rainbow shape will pop-up and down as you open and close the book.


Fold the rainbow on the horizontal crease.


Open sheet and fold horizontally in half.

Close vertically to half way.
