

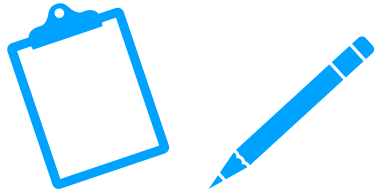

In this lesson we will:



- I will demonstrate how to use '**BODMAS**' to help us solve multi-step calculations, including using brackets when it is appropriate. I know that these types of questions can feature in 'Numeracy Ninja' too.
- It is '**Down's Syndrome Awareness Week**' and I thought that this would be a good time to discuss this disorder, which people are born with. How can Down's Syndrome affect people and their families and what difficulties and challenges can it present? Also, what strengths are linked to this condition?
- We will also take time to discuss a variety of situations in which **discrimination and inequality** can take place, with our activity, 'Fair or Unfair?'

Tuesday 23rd March - Follow up challenges/ suggested learning:

(Remember that these can be attempted and revisited at any time throughout lockdown. :-)

'Numeracy Ninja' - It's time to continue your training, as you work to complete sessions 4 and 5. Reflect on the types of questions you may have found most challenging last time and what you may need to do differently. The answers will also be available on the website so you can check and discover the belt colour you have achieved. Remember to use the answers to help you to discuss and learn from your errors too.

'Fizz, Buzz, Bang!' This game is such fun and great for showing your understanding of number properties, as well as testing your listening and thinking skills. Here is a reminder of how the game starts:

" One, FIZZ, three, FIZZ, BUZZ, FIZZ, seven, FIZZ, nine, FIZZ BUZZ BANG, eleven, FIZZ, thirteen, FIZZ....."

Extra challenge: Use the word 'Pop' instead of saying multiples of 3. So 6 will become 'FIZZ POP' etc.....

Countries and flags of Africa: I have included an '**African countries quiz**' as well as a document showing you the answers. Take time to study the Africa map closely and you may find it more helpful to focus on memorising and naming a small group of countries, before progressing to other ones.
